Special Tooling & Machining World Conference and Exhibition moves to South Africa



The International Special Tooling and Machining Association (ISTMA), the world's largest representative body for global tooling manufacturing has announced that it is moving its triennial World Conference and General Assembly from China to South Africa.

Representatives from 22 countries will gather in Cape Town in September 2023 for the 16th ISTMA World Conference. Tooling is the key constituent in the manufacture of products. The International Association's World Conference, General Assembly and constituent meetings of regional groupings ISTMA Europe, Americas, Africa and Asia will coincide with the All Africa Expo and the event will collectively be known as All Africa Exhibition ISTMA 2023. PtSA, the industry representative body for the tooling manufacturing industry in SA and currently the only African member association of ISTMA World, will host the event.

The ISTMA World Conference will take place at the **Cape Town International Convention Centre from 18 to 22 September 2023**. The President of ISTMA World, Bob Williamson, said this follows a unanimous decision by ISTMA World to move the Association's 16th World Conference, originally scheduled to take place in Shanghai, China in 2023, to Cape Town due to COVID-19 restrictions in China. The decision was made at an ISTMA General Assembly meeting attended by 14 member countries in Stuttgart Germany in May this year. Bob says the decision was supported by the China Die & Mould Industry Association (CDMIA). CDMIA will now host the 17th ISTMA World Conference in Shanghai in June 2026. He welcomed the decision and said it created a win-win solution for ISTMA and both China and South Africa.

According to Bob, the All Africa Exhibition ISTMA 2023 will focus on sustainable developmental approaches and ways to optimise technical and skills development in manufacturing. The event will offer significant benefits to manufacturing in Africa as the local tooling manufacturing industries will be exposed to the latest global manufacturing technology, the world's leading tooling houses and the most influential people in the industry.

ISTMA World is a non-commercial international association serving as a global platform for cooperation and knowledge sharing between 23 member associations in 22 countries in the tooling and machining industry. Collectively, ISTMA member associations represent more than 8 000 companies with a collective annual turnover in excess of 120 billion US dollars.

Showcase your Products & Services to the world

ALL AFRICA EXHIBITION will serve as the prime show-case for tooling manufacturing in Africa. It is expected to draw exhibitors and visitors from at least ten countries across the African continent.

The Exhibition will feature country pavilions and exhibitions. A comprehensive display by African production technology companies will highlight manufacturing pockets of excellence on the continent.

High-end African machine tool products for the automotive, drone manufacturing and packaging industries worldwide will be put under the spotlight.

The Exhibition will also host an African Investment Indaba Conference aimed at sensitising potential investors about African investment opportunities and soliciting support and investment for the growth of manufacturing on the continent.

Zimbabwe launches TDM Association to Revive Toolmaking Industry

On 14 June 2022, a group of key role players in the tool, die and mouldmaking (TDM) sector in Zimbabwe, launched the country's TDM Association. Tapiwa Samanga (virtual), and Bob Williamson, PtSA Executive Director and President of ISTMA attended the launch in Harare.

The Zimbabwe Tool, Die and Mouldmaking Association (ZTDM) intends to revive the toolmaking industry, a key pillar of the manufacturing sector value chain in supporting the Government's National Development Strategy 1 (NDS1) thrust on industrial regeneration.

The Zimbabwe TDM sector used to be very vibrant until the mid-90's when it went into fast decline. Presently the industry hardly exists although there is a registered toolmaker course.

David Muvindi, the newly elected chairperson of the association, said **most manufacturing companies** were importing their tool, die and mouldmaking products, especially new moulds and other tooling products and what they are sourcing locally are mainly repair services for the imported tools.

"There has now been a realisation that the tool, die and mouldmaking industry must be revived. It ties up

the with government's ND\$1 goal of reviving the manufacturing industry in Zimbabwe. Hence the formation of the ZTDM Association, will promote the revival of the TDM industry in Zimbabwe, and in turn, contribute to the rebuilding of the manufacturing industry for the overall benefit of the Zimbabwean economy," he said.

He emphasised that US\$2,5billion was required to capacitate the industry in terms of modern equipment, which needs to be imported. "Those practising are using very old machin-



ery to the extent that a mould manufactured in China can be cheaper than one manufactured here due to old technology," he said.

He added that the tool, die and mouldmaking industry was a key supporting pillar of manufacturing the world over. "For the beverage industry to produce the drinks that they produce, they must have plastic bottles and closures to package the drinks. The bottles and closures are supplied by plastic manufacturing companies. To produce these bottles and closures, the plastics companies must have moulds (made out of steel) that they use on their machines to mould these bottles and closures.

"It is the TDM companies that manufacture and service these moulds," said Mr Muvindi. He said the ZTDM as a new association was meant to bring together industry practitioners in the field of tool, die and

mouldmaking, spanning across industries such as plastics, petals, and foundry and their allied industries.

Among the association's objectives are to promote the interests of the industry, such as skills development and retooling, to promote and disseminate to members and the authorities any information of value and use to the and to represent the interest of the members and of the industry in all spheres.

Mr Muvindi said the association would also lobby for favourable government policies for the industry for the benefit of the industry and the country. Government sees the manufacturing sector growing by 6,5% in 2022 and according to NDS1, the sector could benefit from resuscitation and strengthening of existing value chains and developing new value chains as well as mineral beneficiation. As part of the strategies for the sector, resuscitation of value chains will be supported by scaling up innovation hubs and industrial parks.

A multistakeholder initiative is underway to upgrade the curriculum and relaunch TDM training in Zimbabwe.

Register Your Company to get access to potential work

Once in a while, the CSIR procures TDM goods and services. Only suppliers registered with the National Treasury as suppliers are considered.

PtSA is proud to offer its members the opportunity to register their company on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (NT-CSD). This is a central supplier database for all government entities; and registration will therefore allow access to a range of potential work, typically through an RFP or RFQ process.

Why should a supplier register on the CSD?

- Suppliers will only be required to register once when they do business with government;
- A supplier will be able to ensure their data is up-to-date, complete and accurate:
- Standardised and electronic verification of supplier information leading to reduced fraud with paper copies and manual processes;
- Supplier will not be required to submit physical tax clearance and business registration certificate to organs of state; and
- Single source of supplier information to all organs of state.

What will be required for suppliers to register?

- All suppliers will be required to complete required information on the CSD website and must ensure it is complete, accurate and comprehensive. The following would be amongst the required information:
- Supplier information i.e. supplier type, identification number, supplier name, trading name and country of origin;
- Supplier contact i.e. preferred contact person, preferred communication method, email address, cell phone number, telephone number, etc.;
- Supplier address i.e. country, province, municipality, city, suburb, ward and postal code;
- Bank account information;
- Supplier tax information;
- Ownership information, i.e. name and identification number of directors, members etc.;
- Association to any other suppliers i.e. branch, consortium member etc.; and
- Commodities the supplier can supply.

A valid email address, identity number, cell phone number and bank account details are mandatory to register on the CSD. Apart from the above, it is foreseen that B-BBEE information will be included in the CSD.


Wagner Systems kick-starts growth with PtSA Benchmarking Process

Wagner Systems, a Western Cape-based member of PtSA, recently presented the outcomes of a rebenchmarking process done by PtSA Enterprise Development in partnership with the WBA Aachener Werkzeugbau Akademie GmbH (WBA Institute Aachen Germany) in 2021. The report was presented to members of the PtSA management team during a company visit in Cape Town.

Lasni Millar, MD of Wagner Systems, said that the benchmarking process, during which the company's positioning against local and international peers is measured and actions determined to be taken for implementation to improve business practices, has been extremely useful. "It would simply have been impossible for us as company to obtain such useful information by ourselves," he said.

"The number of items produced has increased more than three-fold and the company has returned to profitability. Improved cash flow enabled us to purchase two new CNC lathes that helped reducing cycle times by 50% in the applications where they are used," he added.

Below is a diagram of the action fields based on benchmarking results that were identified and improvements that were made according to this report.



Lasni is especially proud of the appearance, layout and improved use of workshop space, which can clearly be seen in the "before" and "after" photographs below. This as result of some of the recommended action plans by WBA, Aachen, after the initial benchmarking exercise done in 2017.
