AAT Composites explains How PtSA Membership benefits the Company's Competitiveness

During the PtSA Western Cape Networking event on 22 September, Malte Scherner, Executive Manager at AAT Composites, which also sponsored the event, enhanced the benefits of being a member of PtSA to the company representatives who attended the event.

AAT Composites is a high-tech design and manufacturing company which develops advanced, lightweight composite products for the leading players in the aircraft interior and aircraft seating industry. All

products manufactured are exported to customers overseas.

The company is reliant on importing aviation certified materials from its international supply chain and there are few suppliers available locally who are capable and willing to support AAT Composites' requirements.

Upon asking Malte why being a member of PtSA is important, he said "generally, one always needs an entry point, a motivation, a 'spark' to join a network of people that individual reason making you think 'let's join' and be part of it. Think of joining a gym, a tennis or rotary club: what would motivate you to join these networks?

For AAT Composites, the initial spark was the PtSA Benchmarking Programme, which delivers a professional benchmark analysis for its Tooling department at very attractive cost. Jendamark Automation named African Technology Company of the Year!

Jendamark Automation, a PtSA Eastern Cape member, was recently awarded at Africa Tech Week in Cape Town for its technological achievements while showcasing opportunities for economic transformation in Africa. The Gqeberha-based company develops digitally enhanced component assembly systems for the global automotive sector.

Quinton Uren, MD and founder of Jendamark Automation, said he was delighted that the company's digital transformation journey had been recognised and rewarded. "I am incredibly proud of our young and dynamic team who have led the way," he said.

"Over the past few years, Jendamark has shifted rapidly from a historically automation-focused company in the manufacturing space into a diversified global tech leader.

"What remains unchanged, however, is our focus on understanding and meeting our customers' needs."

Jendamark's digital services director, Yanesh Naidoo, said the company's digital manufacturing technologies delivered an African-born, humancentric response to the demands of the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

It's time for Africa to shine

"We understand the challenges that many developing economies around the world are facing, and we must change the paradigm on how we use technology to solve these challenges."

Yanesh explained that, unlike more developed economies, where a shrinking workforce necessitated automation, Africa's strength was its human capital. "By digitalising manufacturing processes, we

can use tech to unlock human potential. We call it 'digital ubuntu' and believe it is the only way to bring more people into the economy and empower them to contribute to society."

Jendamark's ecosystem of digital productivity and efficiency solutions is marketed under the Odin Manufacturing brand and encompasses a range of factory functions from maintenance to quality assurance and realtime reporting on production data.

Juane Schutte, Odin Manufacturing Head said the win was further validation that Jendamark was solving the right

problems. "We are on a mission to accelerate digitalisation in small and medium factories in Africa at a low cost, allowing semi-skilled shop floor personnel to do much more advanced work. We see humancentric factories as massive opportunities in accelerating skills development and enhancing the economic impact in Africa."

Juane added that localised manufacturing, using digital tools for on-the-job training, was part of the solution to the unemployment crisis in SA.

The company has been actively involved in provided new technologies to several schools in the Nelson Mandela Bay area. Most recently, it provided seven schools with tablets and smartphone access to an online pilot programme which offers tutoring and support in mathematics.

Industry will be served by qualified machinists with improved skills and competencies contributing to the competitiveness of South Africa's manufacturing sector and addressing some Industry 4.0 requirements. The purpose of the qualifications is to prepare a student to operate in either one of the above-mentioned trades.

Who can apply?

The range of students doing these courses are people who would like to gain access to employment in the Tool, Die, Mouldmaking and Special Machining industries, those with a specific interest in manufacturing and the production of tooling and those who want to upgrade their knowledge and skills. Each part qualification course includes Knowledge Modules, Practical Modules and Work Experience Modules in its curriculum.

Entry requirements

- NQF Level 4 with Mathematics and Science, or
- N3 Engineering studies with Mathematics and Engineering Science

Each of the courses are modular and competency-based (not time-based). Please contact the Centre Administrators as indicated below to find out about the duration of each course as well as the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and/or qualifications to achieve the competency level required. Depending on the presentation of the various modules, an individual can select to do the various Knowledge and Practical modules as individual short courses. Certification, however, can only be achieved once all the modules as well the Work Experience modules together with the Integrated External Assessment are successfully completed.

There is No Limit with 3D Printing

In the beginning of this year, one of PtSA's newest members, the Engineering Hub Precision Engineering Department in Gqeberha (Eastern Cape), acquired the Raise 3D Printer, to extend their 3D printing services.

Duane Kritzinger Head of Precision Engineering at the Hub said "We are super excited to be heading into a new direction of possibilities with this machine after slowly getting into the 3D printing sphere over the last couple of months. The machine provides a lot more versatility with it being able to print with dual nozzles and a much larger printing capacity, and with a high degree of accuracy. We are now able to print parts to maximum build volume of 305mm x 305mm x 600mm which is really quite big for printers in this segment."

The machine has already been printing every day since it arrived showing the trend of growth in the 3D printing scene over the last couple of years and will certainly be a major asset to the Hub in the future when it comes to prototyping and manufacturing of intricate parts. "We have been using the machine extensively for new project prototyping and an array of new components otherwise impossible to machine conventionally in a machine shop. This has helped us to see if machining is in fact possible or feasible. The process has also helped to cut down on downtime and scrap in the machine shop as we are able to 3D print actual parts before manufacture and ascertain where improvements can be done or where mistakes

are to be avoided," Duane added. With 3d printing, the limit of possibilities to create parts is just about endless especially with the various types of material that can be printed with. Gone are the days of just printing with single types of materials; there are currently various options such as Nylon, PLA, ABS, PETG, PVA, Wood filament and much more.



"We are hoping to secure a

metal 3D printing machine in the not-too-distant future which will be the next step in our engineering evolution as a company with our status quo being not just happy with staying relevant and embracing new technologies as a company but pushing the boundaries of what is possible in engineering. 3D printing has catapulted us to the next phase of engineering excellence," Duane concluded.

Improving Grinding Operations smoothly and accurately

Robbie Deyzel CNC (Pty) Ltd, an Eastern Cape-based PtSA member, has been looking for an improvement in the company's grinding service delivery solutions for a while, and has recently acquired the HDCNC WEIHAI Huadong Surface Grinding machine with PLC auto grinding control.

Loftie Deyzel, Director at the Company, explained that **Robbie Deyzel CNC (Pty) Ltd** continuously seek ways to optimise and improve its services without compromising on the quality of workmanship. "The UADONG surface grinding machine is known for its auto cross feed, hydraulic feed and automatic feed with a 635mm worktable length and

305mm in width. It is easy to operate and designed for continuous operation at maximum speed, accuracy and minimal heat accumulation which ensure the best machining results".

The team at the company agree that one of the prominent advantages of this



grinding machine is the fact that it is very quiet during operation. The company can also now produce heavy parts, as this machine offers adjustable roughing, finishing, and spark -out strokes with hydraulic longitudinal table movements and are designed for high table load capacity.
